- you paid \$561 per child or more for 3 months of childcare between April 1, 2020 and December 31, 2020 (receipts required)
- the child care you paid for was provided by (receipts, bills or invoices required) someone other than the child's father or mother, your spouse or common law partner, or someone who is dependent on you or dependent on your spouse or common law partner ([see factsheet for details](#))
- you required the child care above because you were working or attending school at a [designated educational institution](#)
- Only one parent or legal guardian may apply for each child. In cases where both parents or guardians apply and meet the eligibility criteria, the payment will be made to the first applicant.
- The benefit is not taxable. However, if you or your partner claim childcare expense deduction on your tax return, you are required to deduct the Working Parents Benefit you received from the childcare expenses you are claiming in your 2020 income tax return
