BUSINESS Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant	 The Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant is now accepting applications from eligible employers, pending available funding. The Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant is an employer-driven program that: Helps businesses and non-profit organizations train new or existing employees for available jobs; and Provides more opportunities for unemployed and underemployed workers to receive training. Through the program, the employer contributes one-third of the training cost, while the federal and provincial governments contribute the remaining two-thirds. 	 Employers: Select the trainees and the training program. Receive reimbursement for two-thirds of eligible training costs. Employ the trainee at the end of training. Employers can make multiple grant applications to a maximum of \$100,000 per fiscal year, and up to \$10,000 per individual trainee. Private and not-for-profit sector employees are eligible. Publicly funded organizations are not. Interested employers must complete the Employer Application Form and obtain a Training Provider Quote. For more detailed information on how to apply, view the Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant Applicant Guide. Each application can only have one training provider quote attached to it. Only fully completed applications will be accepted for assessment. Applications will be accepted, assessed and approved based on available funding. Please note that a completed application is not a guarantee of funding. Training requests must be approved and a contract negotiated between the employer and the Government of Saskatchewan to be eligible for program funding.
